With reference to reports published today in the local media that the Malta Police Force carried out 7000 on-the-road car inspections in the last quarter of 2020, Doctors for Road Safety would like to express their highest commendation, respect and support. Such interventions constitute one of the most effective ways to raise road safety standards by increasing police visibility, identifying and sidelining potential threats, and most importantly delivering a tough and consistent message of zero tolerance to any and every violation which puts lives at risk.
